

Day Tours & Excursions

This document summarizes some of our recommended excursions & tours at Victoria Falls. It doesn't aim to cover absolutely everything you can do, but it gives you our candid opinions.

Most of the excursions below are available from either side of the Victoria Falls.

Times & prices of the excursions may vary by specific supplier so these prices & timings may differ slightly at time of quote. Water levels will also influence whether some of the water-based excursions are available at your time of travel.

Notes

The Zambia excursion prices below assume that you are staying at one of the Falls Resort Hotels eg The Royal Livingstone. If you are staying at one of the riverside lodges, there **may** be extra transfer costs. (But usually these lodges transfer their guests to the various activities).

On the Zimbabwe side transfers are included in the price from hotels IN Victoria Falls town. Again rural lodges usually offer complimentary transfers to activities.

Finally Park fees are mentioned but not included in the price given, as they are subject to change:

Zim side - \$30 park fee, \$10 river usage fee (for cruises, rafting) Zambia side - \$20 park fee, \$10 river usage fee

Tours of Victoria Falls

It's a truly awe-inspiring experience!

Private and Scheduled tours

These tours usually take place in the morning or afternoon and last $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 hours. This takes the form of a walk in the natural rainforest with a knowledgeable and informative local guide. You'll discover how the Falls were formed and what local customs and traditions surround them. En route you see the 'Big Tree' and your guide will give a brief history of the Falls as well as detailing the flora, fauna, bird & wildlife and other points of interest. Guides are also happy to assist you with photographs. Take a raincoat and something to protect your camera!

If you are staying close, at the Royal Livingstone Hotel or the Avani Zambezi Resort on the Zambian side or the Victoria Falls Hotel or Ilala Lodge on the Zimbabwe side, you can easily visit the Falls on your own. But if you are staying further away, you'll need a transfer/tour. Or if you wish to visit the Tours on the Zim side if staying in Zambia.

Zambian side:

One particularly good vantage point is across the Knife edge bridge, where you can have the finest view of the Eastern Cataract and the Main Falls as well as the Boiling Pot where the river turns and heads down the Batoka Gorge. Other vantage points include the Falls Bridge and the Lookout Tree which commands a panoramic view across the Main Falls. Raincoats are provided when needed.

Notes:

- Private tours are possible but you need to pay for SIX people so it would be triple the cost for 2 people for example.
- During the low water flow period, from mid
 September to mid January) we recommend that you visit the Falls from the Zimbabwe side

Lunar Rainbow Tour of the Falls


Lunar rainbows, also known as 'moon bows', are rainbows that take place at night, when a rainbow is seen in the light of the moon. Victoria Falls is one of a very limited number of sites around the world which enjoy these moon bows.

The lunar rainbow is a spectacular event that can be seen only during the full moon, so the lunar rainbow tour is only conducted for 3 days every month during full moon at the Victoria Falls. You'll be accompanied through the Rainforest by a guide who will give a brief history of the Victoria Falls themselves as well as other points of interest. The guides are happy to assist with photographs!



Chobe Day Tours

The perfect day tour if you are spending 3 nights of more at Victoria Falls.

Chobe National Park in Botswana is only a 1½+hour drive from the Victoria Falls.






A Full Day tour

This is a very full day but quite a good option if you are not visiting Botswana and you have 3 nights at Victoria Falls. Chobe National Park in Botswana is only a 1¾-2 hour drive from the Victoria Falls. The day starts with an early morning pick-up. You cross the border into Botswana and head for the Chobe River. Your safari begins with a river game viewing cruise on the Chobe River with refreshments while the boat takes you close up to the wildlife and waterfowl along the river. The cruise ends at around 12h30 and you are taken to one of the riverbank lodges for lunch. In the afternoon, you enjoy an open vehicle game drive into the Chobe National Park, with a chance of spotting lion and buffalo as well as numerous plains game species. You arrive back in the early evening.

You return to the border post at approx 5pm and from there you are transferred back to your hotel arriving around 6pm. The cruise and the game drive each last approx. 2½ hours and can be swapped around so that you can opt to enjoy the game drive in the morning and the cruise in the afternoon.

You can choose between a full day (approx 10 hours from 7.30am to 5.30-6pm) OR a long morning tour, just doing the river cruise and lunch. It excludes the Chobe park fee of \$25 pp & any visa costs).

River Cruises

A sunset cruise on the Zambezi River is one of the classic activities of Victoria Falls.

Though the sunset is very romantic to be on the river at sunset, some of the boats are large (well over 100 people). . .



Sunset Cruise

Zambian Side

Various boats offer this excursion. For example, the African Queen (on the Zambian side) is a triple deck, 70 ft catamaran, furnished with Rhodesian teak, beech wood and brass finishes. It takes 110 passengers and serves drinks and snacks. A more exclusive experience would be to book a place (for a supplement) on the Captain's Deck which takes only 12 people. If you like the idea of a smaller boat, consider the sunset river safaris instead. You can also opt to take a morning or lunchtime cruise (including lunch) for 2 hours.

Zimbabwean side

The standard boat has 80 people whereas the Luxury sunset boat (price below) is for only 30 people. You also have the option to enjoy a dinner on the Zambezi River. Sundowners and snacks will be served followed by dinner and local drinks (beers, wine & soft drinks). The **Ra-lkane** is a small luxury cruise boat that is outfitted in period style. This cruise boat takes only 14 people and offers a more intimate river experience complete with period detailing, historic memorabilia, fine cuisine and refreshments.

Larger boats have a signature/captains cabin option as well (upper deck).

River Safaris (Both sides)

This is a more intimate alternative to the larger sunset boat cruises - it's also a great way to explore the river as these jet-propelled boats can operate in water as shallow as 20cm.

As a result, the operational range is greater than other boats, able to cross the 'rough terrain' of the river, giving access to places where the larger boats cannot go. Elephant, hippo and wonderful birds are the main wildlife attractions, and the views and sunsets are highlights. Choose between breakfast, lunch or sunset trips.








Elephant Encounters

This is a unique elephant 'experience', with highly trained guides that are experts in the behaviour of elephants and the wildlife around them







Elephant Encounters (& Jet Extreme)

Be witness to this mutually enriching and rewarding relationship between man and elephant in a modern day Africa. It offers a closer insight into the world's largest land mammal, the African Elephant.

During the Elephant Art safari a private tutor will guide guests through a painting workshop, with the elephants as the subjects. The elephant Encounter allows guest the opportunity to unobtrusively observe and learn about the biggest personalities in Africa. These are offered on both sides of the Falls

Zambia only - combine an Elephant Interaction experience with a Jet boat cruise up the river to The Elephant Café as well as Lunch or Dinner. (Breakfast and High Tea excursions are a possibility but only with a minimum of 6 guests)

Water Activities

For years Victoria Falls has been associated with white water rafting.

The rafting takes you through some of the most exciting rapids in the world, alternating with quieter periods between rapids when you can drift along and appreciate the breathtaking gorge scenery.



White Water Rafting

Note: No children under 15 years allowed.

Make no mistake, this is an adrenalin-filled adventurous activity with an element of risk and we recommend you are reasonably fit as there is a fairly steep walk into & out of the Batoka Gorge as well as the white water rafting activity itself is quite intense. The rapids on the Zambezi River are officially defined as Grade 5 by the British Canoe Union (Grade 6 is commercially unrunnable!)

The key thing to note is that there are various trips on offer – depending on the time of year and the water levels. Low water rafting runs from about mid-July to the end of January. The best months are usually August and September. High water rafting runs approximately from the end of January to mid-July. Which rapids you run, and the number, depends on whether it is low or high water.

Note on prices: Several companies offer white water rafting. The price is with our preferred supplier but subject to availability, we may use a second operator in which case the final price may be slightly different.





Low Water Rafting

The full day white water rafting trip includes approx 19 / 21 rapids, lunch and takes about $7\frac{1}{2}$ to $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours in the day, including the strenuous walk out of the gorge and the transfer back to your hotel (7.30am to approx 3.30pm)

An advantage of the full day rafting is that you don't have to climb out of the gorge at the end of the day – rather you can opt to take the cable car lift at the end. (If you take the morning half day option you have to hike out and believe us – it's steep!) The afternoon ends with a cold drink or beer.

The half day options are only available during the low water season (mid July to January) as in the high water season the water runs so swiftly that half days are too short. A half-day white water rafting trip in the morning takes in rapids 1 – 10 and includes breakfast, light lunch and drinks for the climb out. It lasts from approx 8.30am to 1.30pm. (Currently not on offer post covid)

High Water Rafting

During the High Water Season you raft only rapids 11 to 25 from the Zimbabwe side with a lunch served at the top of the gorge after the climb out.


You start at 7.30am and finish approx 1.30pm or earlier depending on how fast the river is running... This section of the river flows swiftly and features huge wave trains and whirlpools.

Note: If the water levels are too high, the river is closed for safety reasons and your trip is refunded.

Livingstone River Float Tour (Zambia only)

If you are not sure about canoeing, a similar ambience can be gained from the popular Livingstone Drift tour every morning. You are collected and taken to the launch site in the Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park, where the trip begins with a safety briefing before boarding the 6 man inflatable rafts. Each raft has its own guide so that you have time to take in all of the sights and sounds.

The Upper Zambezi has numerous heavily wooded islands, which are dissected by channels that may be several kilometres in length and vary in width from one to twenty meters.

The vegetation predominately consists of ebonies, water berries, palms and a tremendous variety of acacia and albizia. Any rapids encountered are small and at their peak are only classed as grade one, which is the easiest grade. The rafts slowly meander their way down to the take out point with their informative guides pointing out animals, bird life and flora & fauna of interest. Animals, which may be viewed, include hippos, crocodiles, elephants, giraffe, rhino, and various antelope, as well plenty of birds. The drift ends at about 10h30 when you head back to your hotel in open game drive vehicles.



Trains

The Dinner excursion is magical and romantic dinner experience.

Enjoy this luxurious steam train harmoniously paired with modern air-conditioned comfort and cuisine as it runs along 15 km of the historic Mulobezi railway line or over the historic Victoria Falls Bridge.







Royal Livingstone Express Dinner Excursion

(Zambia only)

The Royal Livingstone Express offers a magical and romantic dinner as it runs along 15 km of the historic Mulobezi railway line through the heart of the Zambezi River Valley. Pullman style coaches have been lovingly restored to their former glory.

You are collected in the late afternoon for a 15 min road transfer to the railway. There's time for photo opportunities and safety talk from the train manager whilst a welcoming drink is served. The train sets off up the Mulobezi Line which runs parallel to the Zambezi River. Views of the sunset are enjoyed while travelling through the Mosi-Oa-Tunya Game Park.

A four course dinner with accompanying wines will be served at 7pm when the train stops for water at the 15 km mark. The loco will then back the train up to the turnaround point, uncouple and move to the front of the train. The train then starts its return journey as dinner continues. You are transferred back to your hotel at approx 9.30pm

Please note: This dinner train only runs on Saturdays (post Covid).


You are collected in the late afternoon for a 15 min road transfer to the railway. There's time for photo opportunities and safety talk from the train manager whilst a welcoming drink is served. Views of the sunset are enjoyed while travelling through the bush.

A four course dinner with accompanying wines will be served afterwards. The train then starts its return journey as dinner continues. You are transferred back to your hotel at approx 9.30pm

07. Livingstone Island Tour

Livingstone Island lies perched right on the very edge of Victoria Falls in the very midst of this thundering mass of water, and is about as close as you get to Falls.



Livingstone Island Tour

(Zambia only)

Livingstone Island is the place from where Dr Livingstone first viewed the 'the Smoke That Thunders'. He was paddled in a dugout canoe through swift rapids towards the roar of the Falls. The Makololo paddlers skilfully landed him on 'Goat Island' (now Livingstone Island) right on the lip of the great chasm.

A few steps through the small rainforest and, on the 16th November 1855, he gazed upon one of the world's most spectacular sights - 'Mosi-oa-Tunya' (The Smoke that Thunders) - which he promptly named after his Queen as the Victoria Falls.

However today you are picked up from Desert Manzi jetty and a skilled boat skipper re-traces Livingstone's approach with a 5-8 minute boat ride.

Access to this unique Island is seasonal and depends entirely on the water levels in the Zambezi River. All visits to the island are during the 'low water' season, which usually begins in mid July and goes through to the end of January. (High water visits are too dangerous.) Five visits are offered daily with a maximum of 16 people per visit.

Three are in the morning, one at lunchtime and one in the afternoon. We especially recommend it from October to January as then you may be able to swim to devil's pool. The morning tours tend to be a little more rushed (but this is the recommended time for the Devils pool).

On arrival you will be taken on a guided exploration of the island, take photos of the Victoria Falls from this extraordinary angle and the intrepid can even take a heart-stopping peek over the island's edge, seeing the water thunders down the 103m drop. After wards, you enjoy refreshments under the shade of a canopied dining area.



The Devil's Pool

For a swimming experience unlike any other, you can even brave the island's very own bathing pool, which forms amongst the rocks along the edge of the Falls. (This is only possible in extreme low water from late September to January, and ideally during the morning tour.)

Please note that you need to be a strong swimmer if doing this earlier on (ie around September-October time) when it's not for the fainthearted.


Some people have complained that it is a little bit of a 'conveyor belt' as so many people want to do the swim to Devil's pool that you don't have much time in the rock pool (only 5-10 minutes) admiring this amazing view.

08. Soft Adventure Activities

For many years Victoria Falls has been an adventure capital of note with serious white water rafting, bunji-jumping and bridge swings on offer.

More recently gorge swings, ziplines and flying foxes have been added to that list...



The Flying Fox

The Flying Fox Is a cable slide across the gorge high above the floor. You can sit or be strapped, face down, looking at the ground far below as you fly across the gorge. No walk out is necessary because you are pulled back.

Imagine taking a running jump into thin air over the chasm, soaring horizontally through the air over the turmoil of the Zambezi below. The gorge at this point is 200 meters wide and 120 meters deep. This is a great appetizer before you try the Zip Line and Gorge Swing.

The Zip Line (Foofie Slide)

Imagine the adrenalin rush traveling a speed of 106 km's hurtling 425m across the gorge, while suspended 120m above the breath-taking beauty of the Zambezi water below!

As the river zigzags down the Batoka Gorges, our cable is suspended across from one side to the other. For this product you are harnessed and attached to a pulley, then launched over the edge picking up speed as you descend over the water and reaching a speed of 106 km an hour.

Gorge Swing

Take a leap of faith from the Victoria Falls Railway Bridge into the Big African Air, and feel the force of the mighty Zambezi River as you plunge towards its boiling waters. Or take a friend down with you, side by side, hold on tight as you swing together into no-man's-land.

Imagine swinging in a child's swing in the playground... now imagine a giant swing 95m long and 120m high above water... a 70m free fall before you begin swinging. The minimum age is 14 years, with a minimum weight of 40kgs.







Cable Slide

This takes you from the Zambian side of the Gorge to the Zimbabwean side over the 100 year old Victoria Falls Railway, on a cable suspended over the Batoka Gorge.

The minimum age is 8 years, with a minimum weight of 20kgs and maximum weight of 120kgs (Tandem with guardian).

Adrenalin Highwire Pass & Abseiling

You can pre-book all three activities for a lower price (than buying them separately) and you can also buy a pass for the Highwire activities and the Victoria Falls Canopy Tour for an even greater saving.

Abseil slide 53 meters down the gorge on the end of a rope either facing the cliff face or looking down into the void. The walk out is up quite a steep slope but it is not far.

Bungee Jumping

With the Falls behind you and the river rushing below the Victoria Falls Bridge this is certainly no ordinary bungi jump. At 111 metres it is also one of the highest jumps in the world and the adrenaline rush is as wild as the river itself.

You meet at the Day Activity
Centre at a time convenient to
yourself and stroll to the Victoria
Falls Bridge with your passport,
passing through the Zambian
immigration point. Including the
walk the entire experience takes
approximately 45 -60mins.

The minimum age is 14 years, (minimum weight of 40kg and a maxweight of 140kg.)



Victoria Falls Canopy Tour (Zimbabwe only)

The Canopy tour (along with various other flying adventures) brings you one step closer to this day dream!

The Vic Falls Canopy Tour consists of 9 different slides, varying in length (with the longest being approximately 85m and the shortest being 40m) plus an exciting cable bridge walkway in the middle. The friendly and experienced staff give you a detailed safety briefing before the canopy tour, taking you step by step through your upcoming adventure. There will be two guides on each tour.

Practicalities: The canopy tour takes approx $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ hours and operate with a maximum of 8 guests per trip. To ensure a private trip, they charge for a minimum of 6 guests. The walk out of the gorge is only 50 meters and should take approximately 10 minutes.

Bicycle Tours

Victoria Falls is brimming with craft markets, enticing restaurants and an array of shops. Explore this exciting town, led by your Wild Horizons guide, to your hearts content.

You can also cycle along the Zambezi River, visit the famous Big Tree (a baobab tree estimated to 3500 years old), enjoy spectacular views of the Batoka Gorges below the Falls and cycle across the Victoria Falls Bridge. We recommend you have basic cycling experience when joining the trip.

Quad Biking

Push the limits as you explore rough terrain on a quad bike. These adventure vehicles allow both novice and experienced riders to explore the area at their own pace.

Choose between the following:

- Eco Trail: Enjoy a trip through the African bush on a quad bike, spotting unique flora and fauna along the way.
- Village Trail
 Embark a trip to a traditional
 African village on a quad bike,
 and enjoy a unique cultural
 experience.

9. Helicopter & Microlight

This is a wonderful and adventurous way to see the full majesty of the Victoria Falls.



Helicopter Trips

The helicopter excursions (colloquially known as the Flight of Angels) are a wonderful way to see the full majesty of the Victoria Falls — especially at low water times. You swoop over the Zambezi River and hover over the thundering Falls for a perfect photographic opportunity. The 12-15 minute helicopter flight will take you over the Victoria Falls and the Zambezi River. The longer flight will take you over the Victoria Falls, then have an exhilarating ride down into Batoka Gorge, along the Zambezi to Rapid 26 and over Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park.

Helicopter flights begin at 8am and continue until last light. Minimum numbers mean that the exact time of your ride will be confirmed nearer to your visit.

Note:\$15 Govt fee paid to operator at time of the flight. If you want a private helicopter ride, then you 'll need to pay for 6 seats.


Microlight Flights

The microlight excursions are more adventurous way to see the Falls. They offer a unique, uninhabited and literally breath-taking view of the Falls and the spectacular gorge that the Zambezi River has carved into the surrounding landscape over many thousands of years. One person and an experienced pilot take a 12-15-minute microlight flight over the Victoria Falls and the Zambezi River.

As with the helicopter excursions, there's a longer 25-30 minute option which takes you over the Zambezi River, circles over the Victoria Falls and its islands. Then you fly upstream along the Zambezi River to Kalai Island, flying low over the Mosi-oa-Tunya Park for unique game viewing.

Daily flying times are between 7am and 10am and 3pm to 6pm, varying slightly by season. The minimum age is 8, however if a younger child is tall and can fit properly into a harness then they are permitted to fly (but all children are charged at full price!).

Please Note - personal cameras are not permitted on microlight flights due to safety reasons.

Cultural & Historical Tours

Explore the largest market in Livingstone - colourful, vibrant and bustling with activity. This tour is a most unusual and rewarding experience for the clever shopper.

The chief has invited visitors into his village to get a glimpse of how his people have lived for generations and to learn a little about their traditional customs and beliefs.



Chief Mukuni's Village (Zambia only)

Mukuni's village was founded around the 13th century and later named after the ruler (Mukuni) on his arrival from the Congo. It is home to the Leya people. This 2 hour tour presents an opportunity to see how the local people live in a real African village.

It has a population of 5,000, a clinic, basic school and boreholes for drinking water. The people of the village are more than happy to show you their huts and take you inside; explain how they are built and decorated.

The village guides introduce you to various craftspeople at work making curios which are sold all around Victoria Falls. You can also pre-arrange to try out the Leya traditional food and beer.

This is a working village and not a purpose built tourist attraction, so it is a true, and sometimes saddening, glimpse of life in an African village today.





Livingstone Museum & Historic Livingstone Tours

For the late Victorians, Dr David Livingstone (1813-1873) was one of the great heroes of their era. The "greatest man of his generation", Florence Nightingale called him. He was a household name, recognized as a courageous explorer of Africa, a tireless missionary and a champion of the fight against slavery. Today he is widely remembered.

The Livingstone Museum is one of a kind in this area. It contains the most comprehensive memorabilia of Dr.David Livingstone, including authentic maps and diaries, and covers the history of the region from the formation right up to the present day. The Museum also contains Anthropological, Natural History and African Culture sections.

Maramba Market (Zambia only)

This is the largest market in Livingstone - colourful, vibrant and bustling with activity. Here the local people sell everything: 'chitengies' (brightly coloured fabric), fruit and vegetables, grains and rice, curios, pots and pans made out of old motorcars, farm tools, chickens, beads and clothes.

A guide will accompany you and, with the help of some bargaining skills, some interesting and authentic artefacts can be bought. This tour is an unusual and rewarding experience for the clever shopper. This tour can be combined with the Mukuni village to make a full morning.

Chinotimba Township Tour

(Zimbabwe only)

The word Chinotimba describes the roar of the water from the mighty Victoria Falls in the local Nambya language.

The Nambya and the Tonga people are the original people of the Victoria Falls area. The majority of people in Victoria Falls live in the Chinotimba Township, which has a population of approximately 60,000 people. On the tour, you will have an opportunity to observe township-life - from the oldest houses to the taverns, the local market and churches. During a visit to the Chinotimba Primary School (subject to the schools being open) you are introduced to the school headmaster and then he or another teacher will take you on a tour of the school after which the children may sing their school song.

Village Tour & Meet the People

(Zimbabwe only)

You are taken to an authentic rural village approximately 20km from Victoria Falls town.

Where you are given the opportunity to watch local villagers going about their daily tasks.

The tour enables the guest to see rural life first hand; visiting rural homes, watching their fields being tended and possibly getting the chance to help in some of the day-to-day chores.

This tour needs a minimum 4 people to be confirmed





Home Lunch or Dinner

(Zimbabwe only)

Experience the true flavours of Victoria Falls with a "home lunch". Wild Horizons will collect you at your hotel or B&B in Victoria Falls Town.

A short transfer takes you to the Chinotimba High Density Suburb.

Here you will be hosted by a local family in their residence and served a traditional African homemade lunch. You may like to combine this with the township tour beforehand.

This tour departs with a minimum 4 people

The Boma Dinner

(Zimbabwe only)

This is not just another ethnic restaurant but a rather unique cultural experience.

Excellent cuisine, including a variety of game meats and traditional Zimbabwean dishes, is accompanied by entertainment throughout your meal from traditional dancers, the Sangoma (story teller) and a local fortune teller who is available for fortune telling.

The Boma is partly open to the spectacular African night skies. A feast of nightly entertainment incorporates Shangaan dancers and singers and a local fortune teller. Guests are welcomed with a traditional greeting in Shona and Ndebele, the local languages. They are invited to take part in a hand washing ceremony before sampling traditional beer and snacks, as a prelude to dinner.

After dinner, guests are invited to wile away the evening with the restaurant's very own Sangoma - a traditional storyteller to learn more about the country's folklore, culture and heritage. The highlight of the evening is the interactive drumming and dancing!



The Mosi-A-Tunya National Park

The Mosi a Tunya National Park offers a great opportunity to combine some safari activities with Victoria Falls. It's ideal for those on limited time who may not have time to visit either Chobe National Park or Hwange National Park.

BUT we don't really recommend the game viewing as it is mainly plains game to be seen rather than predators.

However, this gives the opportunity for more active safari such as bush walks, specialist birding safaris, fishing safaris and horse-riding are all on offer.

The Zambezi National Park

The Zambezi National Park is about 1.5 to 2 hours away.

The game viewing is not to be compared as it is mainly plains game to be seen rather than predators (though lion and leopard are both present).

The game drives in the Stanley and Livingstone (S&L) private concession within the Zambezi NP are recommended, especially as there is a chance to also see the endangered Black Rhino.

As well as morning and afternoon game drives, bush walks, specialist birding safaris, fishing safaris and horse-riding are all on offer



Adventure/Safari Pass (Zimbabwe Side)

These passes are ideal if you are not sure what activities you may want to do.

The Adventure pass (\$315pp) gives you a choice of two excursions and a complimentary sunset cruise on the Zambezi. (Choose 2 of Adrenalin High Wire/Night game drive with Dinner or 13 min Helicopter flight)

The Safari Pass offers a Chobe day trip with 1 of the above (\$290 pp), or 1 of Elephant Encounter/White water rafring/Solo Gorge Swing or Zipline (\$255 pp).

The Zambezi Classic (\$90) combines a Tour of the Falls, Lunch at the Lookout Café and a Sunset cruise.

Plus Adrenalin Highwire Pass (see 7 above - \$163pp) & Cultural Connection (see 10 above - \$85)

Please note that Park/river usage fees are applicable for some of these activities and are not included in the rates.
